Go back in time to evoke a time when Montreal was living its golden age and was considered the "metropolis of Canada." We will visit the old St-Antoine district where



BAnQ CHRONICLE

Montreal in pictures

Are you aware of the digital BAnQ? It's very simple: you can access it on the Web at numerique.banq.qc.ca. You can explore the collections and archival documents kept by the Bibliothèque et Archives nationales du Québec (BAnQ), which constitute the memory of Quebec and testify to its cultural and social dynamism. In particular, there are nearly 40,000 geographic maps representing Quebec's territory from the era of New France to today.

A significant proportion of these documents relate to Montreal, as is the case with the map reproduced here: Plan of the Town and Fortifications of Montreal or Ville Marie in Canada by Thomas Jefferys, first published in London in 1758.

The second most important city in New France, Montreal was a prime target for the British army during the Seven-Year War. When Quebec fell to the conquerors in 1759, Montreal became the de facto capital of New France. But its fate was already sealed as the city was cut off from its supply networks from France. In September 1760, General Jeffrey Amherst led forces from New York which took possession of the city and ended the war.

The creator of this plan, Thomas Jefferys, was the King of England George III's geographer. The plan represents the fortified city of

Montreal and its surroundings. Some historians have nicknamed it the "spy map" since it was said to be based on the observations of a British spy present in Montreal between 1756 and 1758. Indeed, before the final victory, there was not supposed to be a Briton in Montreal. George III's subjects would therefore, in principle, not have been able to draw such an accurate plan of the city.

Jefferys published the plan on several occasions, notably in the London-based *Universal Magazine* at the time of the celebration of the conquest. The people of Great Britain were therefore curious to see what these cities in North America, now under the British flag, looked like.

BAnQ digital also contains many postcards from Montreal. Stretching from the late 19th century to the 1960s, this unique collection constitutes a fascinating faceted portrait of the metropolis. While these types of documents are in large part dedicated to architecture and tourist sites, they do not nevertheless ignore human activities. The collection is full of scenes from the daily life of Montrealers in the past. Merchants proudly posing in front of their shop window, Mount Royal skiers or rodeo riders in action all give testimony of a thriving city.

The surroundings invoke the ambition and the grandiose dreams of a Frenchspeaking elite which distinguished itself, and whose traces are preciously preserved by the Château.



A temporary exhibition at the Château Dufresne revisits and investigates the life trajectory of this practically unknown woman before Ms. Gill became interested in her. Her romantic novel also takes us back to the industrial past of the former town of Maisonneuve, when shoe factories were legion and the Dufresne family business was among the most important.



FRAUD AGAINST SENIORS: ARE YOU EQUIPPED TO DETECT AND THWART THE EMOTIONAL BLACKMAIL OF FRAUDSTERS?

he phone rings. You answer. A grandson is calling for help. He says he is imprisoned in another country. An advisor from a financial institution tells you that your investments are threatened or that you have been defrauded. A government official informs you that your immigration application is irregular and you risk being deported from the country. In short, fraudsters use different stratagems, but always with the aim of surprising their victims and scaring them. They put them in a state that will prevent them from thinking, checking or questioning and then offer them the miracle paying solution.

By creating a sense of urgency, fraudsters destabilize victims. By placing victims in such a state, they prevent them from resorting to their usual protective reflexes. As victims appear to be in the wrong or feel compelled to act, they will be open to quick fixes. You guessed it, scammers have the perfect solution to the problem they themselves created. They will be the Good Samaritans. To resolve the stalemate quickly, they will ask victims to withdraw cash or buy other types of value such as Bitcoin or gift cards. They will collect the money that will then disappear forever, along with the scammers, of course!

If you receive a fraudulent call, you can short-circuit the ploy by regaining some composure.

Question, hang up and confirm

Break the momentum; restore your balance; regain your senses. Question the person that is talking to you. Ask for some details that only you and the person concerned would know.

- Even if you think you are talking to the person in question, tell them that you want to check for yourself with those around you; that you are going to stop the conversation.
- Do not allow yourself to be drawn into keeping the story a secret, of confiding in each other only so that no one else finds out about the situation. The scammer wants to stop you from checking.
- Do not have a conversation with the person who is asking for your funds: the more you talk to them, the more they will find ways to convince and manipulate you.
- Hang up and call to check with those around you, contact your financial institution or the government department concerned.

If one of your loved ones is truly in distress, you will be able to help them after confirming with those around you. By calling your financial institution, you will be able to protect your assets yourself. Contact a government department directly to validate if there really is a problem. These are all strategies to regain your calm, your senses and restore your balance.

To get help or report fraud

In case of emergency, dial 9-1-1.

You can also contact the Canadian Anti-Fraud Center to report fraud, by calling 1 888 495-8501 or report it directly on their website at antifraudcentre-centreantifraude.ca.

You can also file a complaint with your local police department. To communicate with your neighborhood police station (PDO), dial 514 280-01XX (XX corresponding to your PDQ number).

In the event of fraud, contact your financial institution to verify the protections to which you may be entitled.
