


after having to cancel the Sugar Shack two years in a row, we are hopeful that we will be able to taste taffy on the snow this year.



# MOBILITY AIDS TO IMPROVE YOUR INDEPENDENCE AND QUALITY OF LIFE

hether at home or elsewhere, autonomy in moving about is the key to aging well while remaining active. Loss of mobility is common in people over the age of 65. In fact, more than a third of seniors living in the community report having difficulty walking and climbing stairs.

We can see a change in how we walk, even when we are fortunate enough to age healthily. We walk more slowly. Our steps get shorter and we have less balance. Our hips, knees and ankles are less flexible. In Canada, osteoarthritis of the hip and knee affects about 45% of people aged 60 and over. It is also

important to note that functional abilities change over time; vision, hearing, muscles and the nervous system can deteriorate, which can contribute to reduced mobility.

We may not walk with the same light and confident pace we did in our youth, but we still have the same composure. We need to slow down in order to avoid obstacles that could trip us up or prevent us from moving forward. We have to learn to do things differently. Sometimes the solution is to get a walking aid, such as a cane or a walker. About 1 in 4 seniors use a mobility aid in Canada.

A **walking aid** helps prevent falls. Consult a healthcare practitioner if:

- you have difficulty walking so that he/she can assess your balance and your need for a walking aid.
- Your walking aid is not suitable, for example if it does not fit your height or you have difficulty using it.
- You have fallen in the past year.





# AN AIR QUALITY TEST: DO YOU **REALLY NEED ONE?**

Frequent colds, bronchitis, itchy eyes, nosebleeds: are these symptoms a little too familiar? Do you have doubts about the quality of the indoor air in your home and the presence of mould? You are probably tempted to have an air test performed to confirm the existence of the mould and to provide solutions, but wait! Do you really need it?

n air test is taking a sample of the air or dust in your home to have it analyzed by a specialized laboratory. The laboratory will determine the type of mould that may be present in the building and its concentration. But what do you do next? Identifying the type of bacteria or mould present in your indoor space does not give you the reason behind its proliferation or how to get rid of it for good.

It should also be understood that performing an air test is ineffective in many cases due to factors that influence the test results. For example, your children enter two cords of wood in your basement for your fireplace. In such a case, there is no need to do an air test. because the result will undoubtedly say that there is presence of mould spores in your indoor air due to the presence of wood, even if the rest of your building is healthy.

Also, let's mention that there are a multitude of sources of indoor air contaminants that affect our health. These contaminants are categorized into 5 main categories: Secondhand tobacco smoke, biological contaminants (mould), chemical contaminants (paints and odours), combustion products and heavy metals (lead or mercury). However, air tests available on the market will mainly identify the presence of mould and bacteria.

So, what do you do if you are unsure of the air quality in your home? Our building experts recommend that you conduct a full investigation of air contaminants. Therefore, a specialized inspector will carry out a careful and instrumented inspection of the building looking for what could affect the quality of the air. The inspector will look for mould and its causes, assess the building's fresh air renewal and identify harmful chemical contaminants.

Considering all this, a complete building investigation by an airquality specialist is much more relevant than an air test alone. An experienced investigator will be able to determine several types of contaminants, the damage caused by mould and the actions to be taken, which a lab report can never do.

# EXPO 67: THE MORALITY SQUAD COMES TO THE THEATRE

n September 25, 1967, at the Youth Pavilion at Expo 67, the amateur theatre troupe Les Saltimbanques were giving the sixth and last performance of the play Équation pour un homme actuel written by Pierre Moretti and assisted by a computer<sup>1</sup>. The troupe obtained a grant from the Ministry of Cultural Affairs to put on an original show presented as part of the Festival des jeunes compagnies. This avant-garde and daring show, where nothing is shown and everything is suggested, received a favourable reception from audiences and critics when it premiered on September 4th. Faced with this popular success, and at the request of the organizers of the Festival, it was reprised a few days later.

As it was playing to a sold-out crowd, The last *Équation pour un homme actuel* show was brutally interrupted by three plainclothes officers from the Montreal Police Morality Squad. Armed with arrest warrants, the police burst onto the scene and arrested the nine actors who were performing in the segment entitled *Érotomanies*, including Carole Laure.



The actors were taken to the police station and spent the night in prison before appearing before the Municipal Court judge the next day. They were accused of participating in an indecent spectacle and had to appear in court. Several defense witnesses, including Paul Buissonneau and Françoise Loranger, took the stand during the trial on November 16, 1967, to defend freedom of expression and

denounce censorship in the theatre. A Committee for the Defense of the Nine was also created with the aim of raising funds to pay lawyers. At the end of the first trial, the Equation pour un homme actuel were convicted of indecency<sup>2</sup>.

Despite this verdict, *Équation pour* un homme actuel resumed shortly after the end of the trial. The play was performed at the Université de Montréal's student carnival, on the Escale theatre boat, and even went on to represent Quebec at the Festival mondial du jeune théâtre de Nancy, in France. The one and only performance at the Festival at the end of April 1968, subsidized by the Ministry of Cultural Affairs despite the controversy, received a triumphant reception.

This revolutionary play, with projections, lights and sounds evoking the evolution of man in a futuristic universe, left its mark on the history of theatre in Quebec. The police intervention it provoked reflects the morals and ultrasensitivity of the right-thinking population of the time.
