

ith the advent and pervasive influence of social media in our everyday lives, disputes over free speech and defamation are becoming more common. However, the notion of defamation itself is not always clear, and requires clarification.

The Quebec Charter of Rights and Freedoms protects freedom of expression and the right to dignity and reputation as fundamental freedoms in its section 3. However, it is important to note that freedom of expression is not absolute! Indeed, it is not because the right to freedom of expression is protected that it is necessarily permitted to say whatever one wants without incurring certain consequences.

Indeed, it is thus a question of a delicate balancing act between the protection of the right to freedom of expression and the protection of the right to reputation.

What is defamation?

In short, when a person makes statements that are used to damage someone's reputation or to spread false rumours, these statements are qualified as defamatory.

To this end, the law establishes that the finding of defamation applies in three different and complementary ways. This principle applies when a person says or writes unpleasant or unfavourable remarks about another

- Knowing that these statements are false:
- Even though this person should know that the statements he/she conveys are false;
- While there is no valid reason for the propagation of such remarks, whether they are true or not.

Defamatory remarks can also take several forms. They can be written, verbal, or even be in the form of videos or photos.

Possible Recourses

Once the defamation is established, it is then possible to take legal action. Consulting a lawyer makes it possible to guarantee that concrete measures will be taken to stop the attack of which you are or have been the victim. Such legal action may result in obtaining compensation for the damages suffered.

Damages

Since defamation and damage to reputation usually fall under a person's civil liability, obtaining compensation for the damages suffered then depends on the existence of a fault committed (the defamatory remarks), damages suffered by the victim, as well as the causal link between the fault and these damages.

It is therefore necessary to prove the injury caused by the defamatory remarks. The mere fact that a person has, for example, spread disparaging remarks about you, without real harm, is not sufficient for the courts to order compensation to the victim.

DURING THE 1940s, A GROUP OF YOUNG ARTISTS FROM THE ÉCOLE DU MEUBLE, THE ÉCOLE DES BEAUX-ARTS DE Montréal, and the Sainte-Marie, de Brébeuf and Notre-Dame colleges gathered around Paul -Émile BORDUAS, VISUAL ARTS TEACHER AND ENTHUSIASTIC ANIMATOR ON THE MOST CURRENT ART OF THE TIME.

These artists, known as the Automatistes, transformed the overall approach to art that was practised in Quebec. They borrowed from French surrealism to form their own vision of painting, literature, theatre and design. They are: Magdeleine Arbour, Marcel Barbeau, Paul-Émile Borduas, Bruno Cormier, Marcelle Ferron, Claude Gauvreau, Pierre Gauvreau, Muriel Guilbault, Fernand Leduc, Françoise Lespérance-Riopelle, Jean-Paul Mousseau, Maurice Perron, Louise Renaud, Thérèse Renaud, Jean Paul Riopelle and Françoise Sullivan.

he different members of the group have lived, studied, practised their art and presented exhibitions in different places in Montreal. Our project "CARTOGRAPHIE DES AUTOMATISTES" tries to relate these different activities and events in each place. The Centre international d'art contemporain de Montréal (CIAC MTL) has prepared texts and podcasts that can be read or listened to on our website at http://ciac.ca/cartographiedes-automatistes/.

You will discover what was done for Muriel Guilbault, for Julienne Saint-Mars-Gauvreau, the mother of Pierre and Claude Gauvreau, in the workshops of Paul-Émile Borduas, Fernand Leduc, Marcel Barbeau and Jean Paul Riopelle. Françoise Sullivan will recall the beginnings of modern dance in Quebec.

In addition, you rediscover emblematic buildings such as:

The Morgan Store

now the La Baie Store, where Paul-Émile Borduas exhibited twice, in 1941 and 1946.

Henry Birks and Sons

where designer Magdeleine Arbor developed her career. The showcases that she developed there were moments followed by many curious people.

The Collège Sainte-Marie

where Pierre Gauvreau, Claude Gauvreau and Bruno Cormier met. In 1941, Bruno Cormier and Pierre Gauvreau exhibited at this College and it was during this exhibition that Pierre Gauvreau met Paul-Émile Borduas, then guest judge.

On August 9, 1948, the
Automatistes launched the
Refus Global manifesto at the
Libraire Tranquille in Montreal,
marking the beginning of an
artistic revolution in Quebec. This
manifesto demanded societal
liberation from the tentacular
obscurantism of Duplessis,
promoted new artistic avenues
and expressed the desire to
transform Quebec society.

74 years later, it is still possible to see the importance that the various members of the Automatistes artistic group had and the publication of this manifesto in the fields of dance. theatre, poetry, design and visual arts. Their cultural legacy can still be found today in contemporary artistic productions. We are pleased to report that Françoise Sullivan, at the grand old age of 98 this year, continues to paint and exhibit regularly at the Galerie Simon Blais in Montreal. An example of continued lucidity, energy and creativity.
