





A RECAP OF OPERATION VISIT A SENIOR 2025

Initiated in 2020 by the SPVM and the Direction régionale de la santé publique de Montréal, in conjunction with the Bureau de la transition écologique et de la résilience de la Ville de Montréal (BTER), numerous community organizations and the CIUSSS de l'île de Montréal, Operation Visit a Senior consists of detection, prevention and intervention activities carried out by mixed teams of police officers and intervention personnel from community and institutional organizations.

For the 5th year running, these partners have joined forces to identify and prevent elder abuse, and to provide help and support, where necessary, to people who are isolated or not known to health, social or community services. This operation also enables special







attention to be paid to certain risks to which the elderly are exposed, such as those incurred during heat waves, or risks tied to evacuations in the event of a fire. Monitoring and prevention are carried out in collaboration with other Ville de Montréal departments, such as the Fire Department, Sécurité civile and the Bureau de la transition écologique et de la résilience.

Between May 15 and June 15, 2025, the various teams carried out 117 door-to-door operations across Montreal, knocking on almost 10,700 doors and talking to over 5,000 people. Thanks to their vigilance, 141 of these people were referred to the CLSC or an aid organization. (Source: City of Montreal Police Department)

Continuing the collaboration between the SPVM and the FADOQ - Région Île de Montréal, a new awareness brochure was produced both in French and in English. The pamphlet is designed to inform the people we meet about the strategies used by fraudsters, how to recognize them, how to protect themselves, and what resources are available to get help.

In addition to being handed out during Operation *Visit a Senior*, it will also be distributed throughout the year during *Senior-Aware* information sessions, presented in collaboration by FADOQ – Région Île de Montréal and SPVM community relations officers.

A look back at this operation is a reminder that all Montrealers can contribute year-round to the well-being and safety of seniors by being vigilant and, if necessary, reporting a person in a vulnerable situation. The Mistreatment Helpline is a provincial telephone hotline for listening, referral and support specialized in elder abuse and abuse of adults in vulnerable situations: 1 888 489-2287.





THE FACES OF THE FADOQ MTL

ROGER BILODEAU, A LIFE OF COMMITMENT AND LEADERSHIP IN THE SERVICE OF OTHERS

Roger Bilodeau is the perfect example of what community involvement can achieve when driven by passion, rigour and a deep desire to improve the lives of others. An active member of the FADOQ – Région Île de Montréal and a central figure in the National Bank's Amicale des retraités, Mr. Bilodeau has devoted over 15 years to building bridges between members, encouraging participation and breathing new energy into the organizations he has served.

His journey with FADOQ began somewhat by chance in December 2008, when he joined the National Bank's Amicale des retraités and automatically became a member of the FADOQ – Région Île de Montréal. It didn't take him long to realize the benefits and advantages of this affiliation. "It's more than a membership card, it's an open door to activities, services and a network that enrich our daily lives," he says.

A Committed Builder

As early as 2009, Roger became fully involved as a member of l'Amicale's Board of Directors. Appointed treasurer in 2010, vice-president in 2012, then president in 2015, he and his team have worked tirelessly to develop the organization, which now has nearly 2,350 members across nine regions of Quebec and even in eastern Ontario.

Under his leadership, the Amicale has adopted a strong mission, vision and values: to promote encounters through social, cultural and sporting activities, and to maintain a lively, accessible information network. "We have always strived to promote socialization and participation for an active and fulfilling life for our members," he explains.

Even during the recent pandemic, Roger and his team were able to adapt thanks to judicious technological choices. "We were able to keep in touch with our members, which was essential in these isolated times," he points out with pride.

His Role at the FADOO

At the same time, Roger was also a member of the Board of Directors of the FADOQ – Région Île de Montréal for several years. His involvement was mainly with the Travel and Activities Committee, where he was able to put to good use his 38 years of professional experience with the National Bank, combined with his university studies, which he completed evenings up to a Master's degree.

What activities appeal to him most? Those that combine usefulness and fun: conferences on health, safety, harassment prevention, but also trips and physical activities that promote socialization. "These initiatives are invaluable for breaking down isolation and maintaining a good quality of life," he states.

Inspiring by Example

For Roger, volunteering is a real source of vitality. "Getting involved allows us to feel useful, to share our experience and to make progress on important issues," he says. He firmly believes that society needs volunteers, and that every commitment, big or small, can inspire others to follow suit.

Even outside his associative responsibilities, Roger remains an active man: golf three times a week, physical training 5 days a week, swimming, cycling... not to mention precious time with his children and grandchildren. "Cultivating our passions and relationships is what keeps us alive and happy," he concludes with the wisdom of someone who has always been able to combine action and reflection.

A Life Dedicated to Service and Community

Roger Bilodeau embodies the very values that the FADOQ strives to promote: commitment, respect, cooperation and the pleasure of active living. A few months away from concluding his term as Amicale president, he remains driven by the same conviction: "When you get involved, you receive as much if not more than you give."


My curiosity and subsequent research were well rewarded. I expanded my knowledge and had a memorable evening!!!!

LES JOURNÉES DE LA CULTURE 2025: A LIVELY CELEBRATION OF MEMORY, DIVERSITY AND AGEING WELL

From June 3 to 5, 2025, the FADOQ - Région Île de Montréal proudly presented Les Journées de la culture, a free event held at the Maison de la culture Côte-des-Neiges. Bringing together shows, lectures, screenings and artistic performances, this rich and varied program highlighted the cultural vitality of seniors and their active role in community life. The initiative was made possible thanks to the support of the Secrétariat à la région métropolitaine of the Ministère des Affaires municipales et de l'Habitation and the Maison de la culture Côte-des-Neiges.





Highlights included a lecture/performance on the correspondence of Onésime Maréchal, a woman of

character who maintained a rich exchange of letters with her children during the First World War. Hosted by Dominique Nantel Bergeron, with the participation of actors Philomène Bilodeau and Ariel Ifergan, this activity transported the audience into the intimacy of a Quebec family marked by history.

The speaker also presented a photo lecture on the Laurier Est neighborhood in the 1920s-1930s, illustrated with archival and family photos, tracing both the evolution of a Montreal neighborhood and that of a family lineage. These personal stories aroused strong emotions and a strong sense of resonance among participants.

The film component was highlighted by the screening of the movie "Dismoi pourquoi ces choses sont si belles" (2024), in the presence of director Lyne Charlebois. This sensitive film recounts the friendship between Brother Marie-Victorin and his student Marcelle Gauvreau, united by their passion for nature, science and faith. The epistolary exchange between the two protagonists deeply touched the audience.



Humor also joined the party with "L'après-midi FUNNY", a show hosted by Mario Bélanger, a humorist well known for his self-mockery and human warmth. Opening the show, Gaston Entérite, a senior comedian, charmed the audience with his mischievous wordplay, proving that laughter has no age limit.



On the music front, the audience was treated to a closing evening with the group Kleztory, renowned for their mastery of klezmer music. With palpable passion, the Montreal guintet revisited the Yiddish musical universe with emotion and virtuosity. Their performance was enhanced by the presence of Polish marimbist Elwira Slazak, who dazzled audiences with her impressive and unusual instrument.

Aboriginal culture also took center stage with a performance by Kahnawake Mohawk artist Barbara Kaneratonni Diabo. Her hoop dance, accompanied by drumming, was followed by a participatory initiation and screening of her short film SMUDGE, offering a personal and engaged look at contemporary Aboriginal dance.

Finally, the show Mythomane, presented by Thomas Hellman and his partner Olaf Gundel, transported the audience into the fascinating world of Greek myths. With his deep voice and poetic approach, Hellman built an inspiring bridge between ancient tales and today's issues.
